## Reopening School in September

Following the issue of Government guidelines on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> July we are currently in the process of finalising our plans for the reopening of school to all pupils from September. Further information is included at the end of the newsletter.

Our plans will help to ensure that all children and parents/carers are safe on the school site.

We will be continuing with our staggered start and finish times (although the actual timings will be revised) and our one-way system on the school site will continue.

Autumn Term will start for pupils on **Thursday September 3<sup>rd</sup>**, as Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> and Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September are professional development days. Teaching staff will be working in school, making the learning environments safe and planning our special Autumn transition curriculum which will help ensure all pupils are back up to speed with their learning as quickly as possible. We will also be introducing some special sessions on wellbeing for all pupils.

Parents, carers and pupils will be informed of the new class/bubble teachers and the staggered start and finish times later this week through a message on Marvellous Me! and through email.

Children's new class teachers will be setting special **Summer Challenges** for children to work on over the summer holidays to help keep their skill sharp. These will also be available on a dedicated space on our school website – [www.archibaldpri.org.uk](http://www.archibaldpri.org.uk)

## **Procedures and routines we are putting in place to help ensure our school is as safe as possible for children, staff and parents/carers when we re-open to all pupils in September include:--**

- It is clearly understood by all parties that young children cannot socially distance. As such, this is neither the governments, nor our plan. Sadly, our school will not look or feel the same as it did before we closed. The safety measures imposed by the government are primarily based on 'bubbles' of children and staff – and as such, the government strategy is underpinned by these bubbles staying apart at all times. We will use this idea of 'bubbles' throughout our school
- Children will be split into bubbles. Following the opening of school to all year groups, a bubble will consist of one year group. Dedicated staff will be allocated to each bubble, with only certain staff working between bubbles –following government guidelines. Every effort will be made to ensure that bubbles do not mix at any point in the school day, including outside time and that as far as possible social distancing is maintained between bubbles.
- Each class will have its own teaching room. Moving around the school will be minimised – pupils will not be taught in the Science Room, Library or Computing Room.
- Following government guidelines, all teachers and other staff can operate across different classes and year groups in order to facilitate the delivery of the school timetable – we will endeavour to keep this to a minimum whilst recognising the requirement to enable a full educational offer.
- Each room will be specially prepared prior to being used by a class. Hand cleaning stations will be established in all rooms being used, and where possible and practical pupils will be seated side by side and facing forwards, rather than face to face or side on.
- All groups of children will have access to outdoor time in designated spaces within the school grounds. Whilst the time may be shared within the bubble (year group), each group (class) will have its own designated space at any one time. Upon re-entering the building children and adults will be required to clean their hands (hand sanitizer).
- A full and increased cleaning schedule will be in operation throughout the day and at the end of the day. In Nursery, and Pre-School the rooms and outdoor spaces will be cleaned at the end of the morning session and the end of the afternoon session using standard products, such as detergents and Milton between each sitting.
- Children will be required to practise increased hygiene routines – they will be encouraged to clean their hands more often than usual, and hand-cleaning stations will be available in all classrooms. Lidded bins are provided for tissues and towels (catch it! bin it! kill it!)
- Children and staff will not be required to wearing PPE – this is the government rule. PPE would only apply if a child suddenly displayed symptoms and needed close personal attention. Appropriate PPE is available throughout the school.
- In order to minimise contact with individuals who are unwell, those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, should not attend school
- If a child or member of staff displays symptoms, they MUST engage with the NHS test and trace process – arrange to be tested and self-isolate for 7 days and their family must self-isolate for 14 days (unless test is confirmed as negative.) Parents and staff to inform the school immediately of the results of a test
- If a child or adult tests positive for COVID 19, the rest of the bubble (including staff) will be sent home and instructed to self-isolate for 14 days.
- Parents and carers will not be allowed in the building without prior appointment. This will also apply to all other visitors to the school with the exception of staff who are timetabled to work with individuals or groups of children (eg Speech and language therapists, Music teachers (TVMS), Sport Coaches (MFC Foundation)).
- Packed lunches will be available for pupils in Reception to eat within their bubble.
- Pupils in KS1 and KS2 will eat their lunch in the dining room. The children will dine in designated sittings and will have designated tables to sit at. They will be invited to collect their lunch from a limited menu at the counter and will have their desserts and drinks brought to them. When children have finished eating their plate/red tray will be taken from them to the return hatch or a trolley and they will remain seated until all in the bubble have finished eating. All tables and stools will be thoroughly cleaned using standard products, such as detergents and Milton between each sitting.
- Appropriate risk assessments will be completed and reviewed at least weekly.
- The practice of 'hot desking' will not be encouraged. Staff are advised to clean any keyboard before using it. Antibacterial wipes will be provided in all classrooms and offices being used.
- Increased signage will remind parents, carers, children and staff of social distancing whilst on the school site.
- Children need to wear their school uniform.
- We will provide remote learning via the school website, Marvellous Me! and Seesaw for children if they are unable to attend school (COVID-19 related).
- We will continue to use the school newsletter to keep our parents and carers informed
- We will continue to receive and act appropriately on advice from the government, Endeavour Academies and Middlesbrough Council

## SUMMER HOLIDAY FREE SCHOOL MEALS VOUCHERS

The Government have announced that in order to help families, the supermarket vouchers distributed to parents and carers of pupils entitled to free school meals will be extended throughout the summer holiday. This includes pupils for whom vouchers had stopped because they had returned to school.

Parents who are already registered for free school meals will receive summer holiday vouchers and don't need to re-register. There have been some unhelpful headlines saying parents only have limited time to register – this is not true.

# Operation Phoenix: Anti-Social Behaviour



Over the summer months, police tend to receive more reports of **anti-social behaviour**.

As part of the re-launch of summer campaign Operation Phoenix, school liaison officers will be focusing on tackling the issues around anti-social behaviour (ASB) before the summer break.

Anti-social behaviour can be **frightening, intimidating** and leave people feeling **unsafe** in their community.

**Some behaviours include;**

- throwing stones at vehicles and properties
- hanging around in groups around communities in areas such as town centres and local shops
- using foul and abusive language to members of the public
- graffiti and littering, damaging equipment or play areas, and
- starting fires in rural areas.
